LAUNCH OF THE MACCABIAH TORCH

The journey of the 2025 Maccabiah Torch began in 2024 with a touching ceremony honoring Israel's wounded soldiers and marking a strategic partnership with the IDF Disabled Veterans Organization. Carried by Evyatar Zaituni, a disabled IDF veteran who was injured during the Iron Swords War, the torch embodies the strength and perseverance that define both the Maccabiah Games and the Jewish sporting community. It also serves as a shining symbol for Maccabiah's commitment to bring sports and rehabilitation to the forefront as a major theme of the Games. Since then, the Torch Relay has embarked on a global journey, visiting Maccabi communities, and making its way toward its final destination—the Opening Ceremonies of the Maccabiah Games in Jerusalem.

This July, 2025, in the heart of Teddy Stadium, before 35,000 spectators and millions watching in Israel and around the world, the torch will be lit to mark the official commencement of the Maccabiah Games.

This year, MORE THAN EVER, sports has become a powerful force for rehabilitation and resilience, making the 2025 Maccabiah Games the perfect platform to honor and support our heroes.

THE WORLD JEWISH SPORTS MUSEUM: A LEGACY OF TRIUMPH AND RESILIENCE

Since its founding in 2022, the Iris Smith World Jewish Sports Museum has stood as a powerful tribute to the history, perseverance, and achievements of Jewish athletes. Located in the Asper Maccabi House, this one-of-a-kind institution spans 1,500 square meters, housing over 1,000 rare artifacts, multimedia exhibits, and interactive experiences. From Olympic victories to historic struggles, the museum tells the extraordinary story of Jewish sports and spirit across generations.

Despite a two-month closure due to the war, the museum saw its most impactful year to date, welcoming over 18,000 visitors.

EXHIBIT: UNBROKEN: ISRAELI SPORTS DURING TIMES OF WAR

To mark one year since the October 7 attacks, in partnership with the World Jewish Congress and Israel's Ministry of Culture & Sports, MWU hosted a special memorial ceremony at the Jewish Sports Museum. The event also served as the official opening of the UNBROKEN exhibition. Among the artifacts on display were Olympic champion Artem Dolgopyat's gold medal, won on that fateful Saturday, and NBA player Deni Avdija's basketball shoes, dedicated to Idan Amedi, who was severely injured in the war. MWU and M25 leadership were in

This powerful exhibition explores the stories of athletes and fans who experienced the Hamas attacks firsthand. It confronts the issue of anti-Semitism in international sports, shedding light on how athletes and sports organizations responded to the crisis. Beyond the tragedy, UNBROKEN highlights the unwavering spirit of Jewish and Israeli perseverance—the determination to overcome adversity, rebuild, and restore hope, from grassroots athletics to the Maccabiah Games, the Olympics, and the Paralympics.

MACCABIAH CAMP EXPERIENCE: A SUMMER TO REMEMBER

Elite Maccabi athletes led sports clinics helping campers train like professionals while connecting to the rich history of the Maccabi Movement. The day ended with a traditional torch ceremony, where each camper received a commemorative medal recognizing their achievements and connection to the Maccabiah legacy. It was a celebration of heritage, perseverance, and unity.

YACHAD ISRAEL PROGRAM

Our program department, Yachad, organizes impactful programs in Israel, uniting participants of all ages and languages from around the world to show unwavering support while strengthening their Jewish identity and connection to Israel.

In 2024, our solidarity missions made a powerful impact. Volunteers supported agriculture, visited October 7th attack sites, prepared meals on military bases, and met survivors and wounded IDF soldiers, offering comfort and strength.

Amid ongoing conflict, the inaugural class of young athletes from the U.S., Canada, Mexico, and Australia arrived in Israel for the Maccabi Israel Sports Experience at Kfar Maccabiah. This year-long basketball program offers world-class coaching, highlevel competition, and a deep connection to Israel. Athletes competed in Israel's IBBA B League while exploring the country, volunteering, interning in hi-tech, and bonding with host families. The program is set to evolve into a premier global sports academy, combining elite training with Jewish values to empower athletes in basketball and life.





MACCABI TZAIR ISRAEL: STRENGTHENING ZIONIST CONNECTIONS THROUGH DELEGATIONS

MWU's global youth movement, Maccabi Tzair (MTZ), operates in over 70 countries on 6 continents. Through events, exchanges, and collaborations, it provides education, leadership, and personal development programming. By emphasizing sports, well-being, and Zionist values, the movement fosters deep connections among Jewish youth worldwide.

A NATIONAL MISSION OF SUPPORT – KFAR MACCABIAH HOSTS RELEASED HOSTAGES AND THEIR FAMILIES

We are honored to share that in 2024, Kfar Maccabiah Hotel was chosen to take part in a vital national mission—hosting the families of returning hostages and, later, the hostages themselves. It was a privilege and a profound responsibility, and we were fully committed to supporting these families during this significant time.

Our team carefully balanced providing top-tier hospitality with respecting our special guests' privacy and emotional needs. We ensured a welcoming, compassionate, and discreet environment for those who had endured so much.

EDUCATION

By the third day of the war, the need for an educational framework for evacuated children at Kfar Maccabiah became clear. A school was quickly established with Maccabi Tzair volunteers and alumni, offering structure, stability, and a sense of security for children and parents. Led by a principal from Sderot, it served children from age four to high school, with a youth center created for social support beyond school hours.

BALANCE: A PLACE TO BREATHE

Thanks to generous donations from the Chicago Jewish Federation and in partnership with Glow Glamping, the Balance Glamping complex at Kfar Maccabiah was created to provide emergency support for survivors of the October 7th attack. Partnering with Safe Heart, a network of 400 trauma specialists, and Brothers in Yoga, the program offers therapy, yoga, and holistic healing to those suffering from PTSD.




MACCABI ISRAEL

Maccabi Israel Is the main organization that unites clubs from all over Israel. Today, Maccabi Israel includes 90,000 athletes in over 450 sports clubs in 45 different sports.

In addition to its role as the umbrella organization, Maccabi Israel plays a key role in assembling Israeli sports delegations for major international events within the Maccabi movement. Over the past year, two delegations proudly represented Israel: one at the Maccabi Youth Games in London and another at the JCC Maccabi Games in Detroit and Houston.

In the United States, the Israeli delegation expanded its presence for the JCC Maccabi Games in Detroit and Houston with 38 delegates, receiving a particularly warm welcome. It included 10 boys' and 10 girls' basketball team and their coaches from Bat Yam, as well as a special soccer team of 14 people (11 players and 3 coaches) from Maccabi Sderot, representing the Gaza Envelope region.



EUROPEAN MACCABI YOUTH GAMES, LONDON 2024 (EMYG)

Young Maccabi athletes, ages 14-18, from 14 countries gathered in London for the 2024 EMYG. Participants competed in basketball, football, futsal, hockey, tennis, and table tennis. With MWU's expertise in implementing games worldwide, we assisted with the registration, marketing, and planning processes of these extraordinary games.

The 65-member Israeli delegation to London demonstrated outstanding performances across various sports. Highlights included a silver and bronze medals from Israeli athletes, including those with special education needs. Additionally, a U16 boys' football team from Ofakim—one of the communities affected by the events of October 7—participated with financial support from Maccabi GB and Maccabi Israel.

Each delegation honored an October 7 hostage through moving ceremonies, including a Kabbalat Shabbat, reinforcing solidarity and community.

EMYG featured cultural activities, tours, lectures, and inspiring speakers with a focus on the mind-body-spirit connection for all of the youth present.

MACCABI AT THE OLYMPIC GAMES



In conjunction with Maccabi USA, MWU was proud to stand with Jewish and Israeli athletes on the ground in Paris during the 2024 Olympic Games through our inaugural Olympics Mission, marking a historic milestone for our organization. The program featured an inspiring session with Israeli flag bearer and Maccabi USA alum Andi Murez, a poignant visit to the Olympic Exhibit at the Memorial de la Shoah, and an insightful dinner with Israeli Ambassador to France Joshua Zarka and Paris Basketball Co-Owner David Kahn.

Our delegation included representatives from Australia, Argentina, France, Israel, Poland, and the United States, reflecting the truly global spirit of Maccabi. Through this initiative, we celebrated athletic excellence, Jewish pride, and international unity on one of the world's biggest stages and look forward to gathering again in Los Angeles in 2028.

MACCABI COMMUNITY UNITES AFTER AMSTERDAM RIOTS



On November 8th, chaos erupted in Amsterdam following the football match between Ajax and Maccabi Tel Aviv, leading to what became known as the "Maccabi Riots."

In response, Maccabi World Union and Maccabi Israel Center, in coordination with Maccabi Netherlands, swiftly mobilized to support Maccabi Tel Aviv fans caught in the unrest. Maccabi Netherlands immediately established a crisis center at the offices, offering aid to stranded, injured, and frightened supporters. Volunteers stood by, ready to transport fans to safety if needed.

A single message to the Maccabi Women's group sparked an

overwhelming wave of support. It was a powerful reminder that our bonds extend far beyond social gatherings—when it truly matters, we stand together.



MACCABI WOMEN'S FORUM: 100 WOMEN IN 100 CITIES

The 100 Women Leaders in 100 Cities campaign was initiated by our team to create a global network of active women's leadership. The goal is to build a Local Maccabi Women's Forum that will promote the forum's objectives and issues in their countries & cities and will take part in international projects.









LEADERS IN THE MAKING: MACCABI FUTURE LEADERSHIP FORUM (FLF)



45 future leaders from 12 countries joined MWU's Global FLF Program in Israel, enhancing their leadership skills, volunteering, and engaging in discussions on Zionism. They visited sites like Sderot, the Nova Memorial, and the Maccabi Jewish Sports Museum. In partnership with Taglit/Birthright, the program provided valuable tools and unforgettable experiences.

"It was truly transformative," shared a program participant. "I gained invaluable knowledge, built meaningful connections, and deepened my connection to Israel."

YESHIVA UNIVERSITY ACTIVITY OVERVIEW



This past year, students were highly active in starting the MWU Israeli Business and Sports Club at Yeshiva University. They successfully hosted 9 independent events and collaborated on 7 additional events, totaling over 15 impactful engagements. The club now has 450 active student participants and has built a strong network of 130 alumni, whom they are working to keep engaged with the mission. The interactive nature of the events allowed for meaningful discussions, with many students leaving feeling more connected to MWU's global network and mission.

EDUCATION, ISRAEL'S PUBLIC DIPLOMACY, THE FIGHT AGAINST ANTISEMITISM

IN 2024, MWU DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TRAINED OVER 2,000 EDUCATORS & LEADERS ACROSS NORTH AMERICA, LATIN AMERICA, AND EUROPE. THESE INITIATIVES REINFORCED MACCABI'S MISSION OF JEWISH CONTINUITY AND ZIONISM, STRENGTHENING GLOBAL JEWISH LEADERSHIP.



Topics included Jewish education, the Holocaust, Israel's current challenge, post-October 7, antisemitism, Maccabi heritage, leadership, geopolitics, innovation, and Jewish ethics.



The 15-year-old "Ambassadors of Truth" Program had a successful 2024. We worked on two different projects:

- In partnership with Unione Associazioni Italia-Israele, we introduced a law to Italy's Deputy Prime Minister to combat antisemitism and anti-Zionism. He pledged support, presenting it on International Holocaust Remembrance Day. In June 2024, we promoted it at the Italian Parliament, with backing from The Milton Friedman Institute.
- In partnership with Unione Associazioni Italia-Israele, MWU
 met Italy's Minister of Education to discuss an educational
 program against antisemitism and anti-Zionism. The Minister
 committed to adding it to the national curriculum after a
 successful pilot. The program combats these issues as threats
 to democracy and Italian values.

In 2024, the Department secured an agreement with Israel's Ministry of the Diaspora, strengthening our Movement's role in 2025 in the fight against antisemitism and the delegitimization of Israel.

ISRAEL'S CASE AFTER OCTOBER 7

After the October 7 attack, the Department launched initiatives to educate on the massacre, Hamas terrorism, and Israel's right to self-defense, reaching millions of Christian leaders across the US and Latin America via Zoom classes and seminars in partnership with the Evangelical Alliance. During the Pan-American Maccabi Games, Romina Shvalb shared her testimony on the horrors of the Hamas attack on Kibbutz Nir Oz, appearing on major TV and radio programs and delivering lectures to the Games' participants.

HONORING OUR PARTNER ORGANIZATIONS



JCC ASSOCIATION

MWU and the JCC Association have a valued partnership that maximizes the impact of two major Jewish engagement platforms.

In 2024, we celebrated 42 years of partnership in the JCC Maccabi Games, hosted by Detroit for a record seventh time and Houston for the sixth time, including the Access program for young athletes with developmental disabilities. Over 11,000 participants from 79 communities took part. International delegations from Maccabi TOs, including Argentina, Ukraine, Hungary, Mexico, Great Britain, and Israel, participated, with a special Gaza Envelope team receiving a warm welcome. Planning for JCC Maccabi 2025 is well underway in Tucson, AZ, and Pittsburgh, PA, bringing 3,000 Jewish teen athletes together.

JCC Maccabi is more than sports—it fosters Jewish pride and connections. Our partnership with the JCC Association enhances this mission through Maccabi Shlichim, who integrate educational experiences into the Games in all JCC Maccabi Host Communities. These representatives support planning, engage with Israeli delegations, and lead 'Hangtime' (Israel Center) activities.

Beyond North America, MWU and JCC Maccabi are expanding Israel experiences. After the successful 2023 JCC Maccabi Games in Israel, discussions are underway for a return to Israel. The 2026 JCC Maccabi Israel Sports Tour pilot aims to establish an annual Israel experience for JCC Maccabi teens.

MWU and JCC Association also collaborate through a shared Central Shlicha, strengthening global Jewish connections. The Central Shlicha supports 22 JCCs, enriches Israel & Maccabi related programming, and ensures Maccabi values remain integral to the Games.

JCC Association has facilitated leadership visits to MWU, including solidarity missions to Kfar Maccabiah, where MWU provided essential support for evacuees from southern & northern Israel. JCC Association praised MWU's rapid transformation of its facilities to accommodate and support displaced families.

This strong MWU-JCC Association partnership continues to reinforce Jewish identity, global connections, and youth engagement through sports, education, and shared experiences.



BBYO

After the October 7th, 2023 attack, BBYO teens launched a **global fundraising effort** for **MWU's Emergency Campaign**. They organized calling parties and created spreadsheets to provide supplies for MWU's headquarters at Kfar Maccabiah, which became a safety zone for evacuated families from Gaza and the north of Israel, as well as for wounded IDF soldiers' families receiving treatment at Sheba Medical Hospital.

The support extended beyond funds, with BBYO ensuring weekly activities at Kfar Maccabiah and investing in extra staff to run these programs. BBYO and Maccabi Tzair collaborated to run the **Teen Club at Kfar Maccabiah**, providing a safe space for relaxation. Chapters worldwide held donation drives, volunteered, and raised awareness about the hostages' release.

Each December, BBYO celebrates **Global Shabbat**, its largest Shabbat experience, with Maccabi Tzair from Israel and worldwide, alongside Holocaust survivors, business professionals, faith leaders, and entrepreneurs. They join BBYO teens for inspiring stories and a teen-led Shabbat experience. This year's Global Shabbat brought the community together in a meaningful way. BBYO's International teen presidents attended the MWU Annual Congress, bringing the voices of the teens to the sessions. In the summer, BBYO hosted the "**Maccabiah Camp Experience**," where they met 500 BBYO teens. In August 2024, **MWU's new Shlicha** joined BBYO HQ to bring Israeli and Maccabi spirit to the chapters worldwide.

Born 100 years ago this year, BBYO is the world's largest Jewish youth movement in the Diaspora, with over 730 chapters in more than 60 countries. It is also the largest Jewish youth movement in North America. Sponsored by Maccabi World Union (MWU) since its creation in 1929, Maccabi Tzair is a classic Zionist youth movement, with its primary strength in Latin America and Israel. Both movements are closely linked to Jewish Community Centers and communal institutions across three continents.



BALTIMORE ZIONIST DISTRICT (BZD)

BZD Solidarity Missions have been central to our partnership with MWU, providing immersive experiences that allow participants from both organizations to engage with the current realities in Israel and our communities. The post-October 7 mission was especially significant, embodying our shared commitment to support during crises. This mission highlighted the resilience and unity of our communities, reinforcing our collaborative efforts to provide relief and fostering mutual understanding.


BZD's Shlichah has played a key role in deepening our connection to Israel. Her dynamic approach to cultural exchange has enriched our educational programs, making the Israeli experience more tangible and meaningful. She actively participates in every initiative, bringing a strong Maccabi and Israeli spirit to our community's activities, ensuring that Israeli culture and values are integrated into everything we do.

The "BMore Israeli - BYachad" program, a collaboration between BZD and Maccabi Tzair, was conceived and developed by BZD's Shlichah. It engages youth and promotes cultural integration, providing BZD teens and Maccabi Tzair participants with a platform for learning and connection through educational sessions, cultural outings, and workshops. The 3-week summer program in Israel is the highlight, where participants from both organizations come together to experience Israeli culture, history, and landscape. This initiative fosters lasting friendships and deeper understanding, promoting Jewish identity and cross-cultural exchange.

The 2024 initiatives have strengthened the bonds between BZD and Maccabi World Union, advancing our shared goals of fostering Jewish identity, supporting Israel, and promoting intercultural understanding. Each program has left lasting impacts that resonate far beyond the immediate participants. We are grateful for the opportunity to collaborate with Maccabi World Union and look forward to expanding these efforts in the future.
